ESTABLISHMENT OF THE SPECIAL REED THICKET NATURE RESERVE OF DORMELLETTO

Regional law of June 1st 1993, n. 16, integrated with regional law of 25.5.2001, n. 12

(Establishment of the special Nature Reserve)

(Boundaries)

- 1. The boundaries of the special Reed Thicket Nature Reserve of Dormelletto extending on to the territory of the Municipality of Dormelletto, are outlined in the planimetry in scale 1:5000, an integrating part of the present law.
- 2. The boundaries of the Nature Reserve are delimited by signs to be placed along the perimeter of the area so as to be clearly visibile from all points of access and so that from each sign the two contiguous placards bearing the writing "Piedmont Region – Special Reed Thicket Nature Reserve of Dormelletto" be fully visible. The placards must be maintained in good condition of conservation and readability.

(Note: the lake boundaries are delimited by yellow spherical buoys).

(Restrictions)

- 1 no motorboats are allowed within the boundaries of the special Reed Thicket Nature Reserve of Dormelletto: this restriction is not applicable to service, surveillance, police and emergency boats. Access with motorboats is allowed at the minimum speed limit of 4 knots, save for more restrictive measures as specified by the navigation provisions set forth by the Board of Directors of the Managing Body with competency over the protected area.
- 2. As a result of the violation specified at §1 an administrative fine will be imposed ranging from a minimum of L.25.000 to a maximum of L.250.000 as provided for by art.12, §2 of regional law dated May 16 1980, n.47, as later amended by art.3 of regional law dated March 2 1984, n.15,.

Art. 5.

(Final Provisions)

- 1. The provisions set forth by regional law dated May 16 1980, n.47, regional laws of March 22 1990, n.12, January 14 1992, n.4 and July 21st 1992, n.36 are applicable to any case or situation not provided for by the current legislation related to:
- a) management and administration positions; b) personnel; c) control; d) restrictions and related fines; e) surveillance; f) allocation of means for territory planning; g) financing and revenues.
